As the quarter winds down, we are preparing for many significant assessments and critical junctures to demonstrate understandings – complete iReady Diagnostic #2 in Reading and Math, experience cognitive discourse in Science to take on the role of astronomers in order to help archaeologists explain the mystery of

a discovered artifact in relation to daily patterns of when the sun and stars are seen while communicating clear scientific explanations, continue to see the ancient past in Social Studies through the lens of archaeologists that use remnants and fragments to explain who lived in a region, how they lived, and challenges/problems that may have occurred to explain their non-existence, and recognize the use of fractions to convert standard measures of length, mass, and capacity. The subject matter has forced students to find main ideas and details in order to summarize, investigate author's message (theme), use vocabulary words to explain thinking, and develop proficiency in writing short and extended reading responses.

We'd like to ask for your kokua. Technology is our greatest asset, but it can also be our greatest challenge. Please monitor your keiki use of text/chats/social media. We have reminded students to be ethical users by practicing digital etiquette such as not sharing personal information, making sure all communication is true and edifying, and always checking their written messages before "sending". We will keep you informed in the future on this topic. As always, please be sure that students are reading daily and coming to school often and on time....

Hello Families!

This month we will be continuing our lessons on Emotion Management. We will be talking about recognition and identification of feelings and how to calm down if and when these strong feeling take over our bodies.

The driving question about emotion management:

Can I recognize and identify my own feelings? Do I know how to calm down when I am feeling upset or uncomfortable? How can I help someone else if I know they are feeling uncomfortable?

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In Physical Education all students will be working on manipulative skills- these include: throwing, tossing, striking, and catching. Kindergarten through second grade will be continuously practicing these skills, while grades 3 through 5 will be assessed on these skills.

Continue to be on the lookout for your child's Social Emotional Learning and Physical Activity Journal this week. Journals need to be completed before their next PE specials class and turned in on the day of their specials.

Please keep actively moving with your child – aim for a family activity like walking, going to the park/beach, or exercising in your house for 60 minutes a day.

STEM/Science: Mr. Sutherland

For December, fourth grade students will begin a unit in circuit design. The will learn how to build basic serial and parallel circuits along with switches, resitors, and led's. They will experiment with paper circuits in order to build their own illuminated card.

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First grade students are finishing up their nest projects and will begin looking at ways to use renewable energy to solve problems in the world. Projects include miniature windfarms and water wheels. For Thanksgiving, they investigated bird display behaviors and built their dancing turkeys.

Third grade students have been looking at artificial and natural selection, from apples to lizards to dinosaurs. They've studied how scientists know what dinosaurs eat and how they walked.

They will finish up their life science unit with investigations into why dogs wag their tails and how to get rid of mosquitos.

Kindergarten worked on a project called Chill City. They needed to figure out how to warm up a town that gets no sunlight in the winter. They used what they learned about transparent, translucent, reflective, and opaque materials to help solve

the problem.

Happy Holidays!! During the holidays, baking with your child is fun. Basic things you will need ...

- 1 box of cake mix (I prefer chocolate) eggs, oil, water, mixing bowl, measuring cups, whisk, 9 x 13 cake pan
- 2 boxes pudding (I prefer chocolate) mixing bowl, milk, whisk Do one box at a time
- 2 containers of Cool Whip (found in the freezer section) defrost before using
- 14 12 cup of mini chocolate chips (I prefer semi-sweet)
 - **OR** crushed Skor / Butterfinger / Recess Peanut Butter cup
- 1 glass serving bowl Large mixing bowl
 - 1) Follow the directions on the cake box, bake, and cool.
 - 2) Follow the directions on the pudding box and set aside.
 - 3) When cake is cooled, cut in cubes about 1" x 1"
 - 4) In a glass serving bowl, layer ...
 - ½ of the cake,
 - one box of pudding
 - one container Cool Whip

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- sprinkle chocolate chips
- repeat
- 5) Refrigerate until ready to serve
- 6) Enjoy

Other combinations -

- 1. Brownie Mix / Banana Pudding / Banana slices for topping
- 2. Yellow Cake / Pistachio Pudding / crushed pistachio nuts
