Believe to Achieve - Stand Up! Be Heard! Let's Excel Now!


Dear Pauoa Ohana,

Grade 5: Ms. Nakamura (C9), Mrs. Oliveira (C10)

This first quarter has been full of learning experiences: learning about one another, learning how to navigate through multiple Google Classrooms, learning the importance of being self-motivated at home, and learning effective time management. This quarter has also been about making adjustments and getting to know ourselves as distance learners. While some students were quick to make adjustments, others have struggled. As their teachers, we want to assure you that we have taken notice and we continue to plan for all students daily.

We would like to take this time to ask for your continued support with your child's attendance. Being on time for class is especially important during distance learning. We want to start instruction when class is scheduled to begin in order to make use of every minute. Your child should be in the Meet by the time class starts, not starting to sign in at that time. We know that we need to be flexible, so if you know ahead of time that your child will be tardy or absent, please email us to let us know.

We would also like your help with monitoring class work and homework completion. All work should be recorded in their Planner daily. We want to stress the importance of staying on top of their assignments and completing their work on time. If students are not able to finish their class work during the day, they are expected to complete this work on their own. We have been giving them independent work time during the day, and while we can encourage them to stay focused and work hard, we are not able to physically be there with them, and this is where the self-motivation and selfmonitoring comes into play. **Have your child show you each Google Classroom's Classwork tab. Tell them to click on "View work" at the top of the page. This will show the assignments for each class, scores, and missing assignments.

During Fall Intersession, we will be asking students to complete their Reading Log daily. Students should also be completing iReady Reading and Math lessons with 75% accuracy or better and 90 minutes per subject per week. iReady should be done across the week and not just on 1 or 2 days. Some students will also be working on missing assignments.

Please continue to email us with any questions or concerns. We want to hear from you. Thank you for your patience, flexibility, and support at home.

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Resource Room: Ms. Sumida, Teacher Grades K-3 (B2)

Teaching character and creating genuine apologies to "hurt" parties. Scott can be impulsive when Sandy comes and destroys a massive building that Scott has just built. His first response is to shove Sandy because he is angry that his building was demolished. Forcing Scott to say sorry to Sandy with a begrudging attitude does not teach Scott empathy.

Joanna Faber, a parenting teacher and author of *<u>How to Talk So Little Kids Will Listen</u>* suggests:

1) **Acknowledge the feelings that preceded the harmful action.** Say something like, Alex knocked over your tower. That's really upsetting because you worked hard on that. Showing your child that you understand he isn't a bad person — just aggrieved and low on impulse control — can help calm him down.

2) **State the problem.** The thing is, we can't have you hurting your brother.

3) **Find a way to make amends.** What can we do to make him feel better? Make suggestions. Faber likes a tangible, token offering — a cracker, a small toy to share.

4) **Brainstorm strategies for next time.** Later, when the smoke has cleared, sit down with your child and ask for alternative options. Like, in this instance, yelling "No!"; creating a code word that brings you into the room when there's a threat to his tower looming; or setting delicate toy structures out of reach of younger siblings.

Remember children are not bad, but may have poor judgement and impulse control.

Flu season in Hawai'i usually starts in October, peaking in January & February. However, the flu circulates our islands continuously, so the flu virus can be caught at ANY time. The flu virus is spread through droplets when someone coughs, sneezes or talks. It is also spread when touching a contaminated surface and then touching your nose or mouth.


Symptoms usually begin one to four days after being exposed. An infected person can spread symptoms with others one day before and up to seven days after getting sick. Influenza is a highly contagious respiratory illness. Complications can lead to dehydration, pneumonia, ear or sinus infections.
