
- 1. Provide your child with a nice quiet spot to learn. Preferably, one that has a solid wall for its background so no one will interrupt or appear in the background.
- 2. Allow your child to independently access their learning during your child's teachers Google Meet. Avoid helping them in the background even if they give an incorrect answer. Let your child learn from their mistakes, as this will build character in your child.
- 3. Avoid recording and taking photos during a Google Meet due to privacy laws.
- 4. The microphone is very sensitive and will pick-up all noise within its reach. Be as quiet as possible or make sure the chromebook is on mute when your child is not speaking.
- 5. The chromebook is for the child only. Parent and/or guardian have signed the agreement acknowledging that your child is the only user of the chromebook. No sibling or adult should be using the chromebook at any time.
- 6. The chromebook is for educational use only and not recreation. <u>Sites are</u> being monitored at all times.

Let is continue to work in partnership as we both, school and parents/guardians, are teachers in your child's life. Have lots of mercy and grace during this pandemic. I know it is very stressful and worrisome. We will continue to partner and work together. We will struggle together and achieve success together.

Aloha Fourth Grade Parents,

It has been a productive start to the year filled with learning rituals and routines, online training, and a slew of technical challenges. Nevertheless, we all pressed on and did not give up. Your children have been doing a wonderful job. We are very appreciative of all the parents and family members that have been a source of support at home. Here are some tips that will help the meetings run smoothly:

- 1. **Background noise** when your child is unmuted intentionally or not, the computer mic picks up all of the background sounds ranging from a sibling's class, conversations, tv, music, etc. These sounds are broadcast over the meeting preventing the lesson from continuing. This disrupts the flow of the lesson and becomes a source of frustration for all. We ask that your child please work in a quiet area separate from other activities in the home, seated upright at a desk if possible.
- 2. Headphones with a mic and mouse are recommended but not required.
- 3. **Chromebooks** to be used for school purposes only. Teachers are able to monitor remotely and can see your child's Chromebook screen in real time. They should be plugged in during the meetings.
- 4. Ohana Help Desk you are encouraged to call 643-DESK(3375) for technical support.
- 5. **Google Classroom** a learning management system for announcements, morning check ins, assignments, resources, Google Meeting link.

NOTE: Parents if you have not already done so, please complete the 2020-2021 Free and Reduced Price Meal Application online at ezmealapp.com. After the application is processed (up to 10 working days), a notification letter will be sent home either by email or via school.


