Thank you for attending the Parent-Teacher Conference. It was so nice to meet and talk with you virtually. Your constant support at home will help your child be successful in second grade.

How to support your child at home:

- Please help us make sure **your child is completing their homework each day. Check their planners daily.**
- **Follow the daily/weekly schedule** if your child is absent that day to make up the work.
- It is pertinent to have your child **complete i-Ready Reading and Math daily for at least 20 minutes.** Your child needs at least a total of 45-minutes for both Reading and Math. The more minutes on i-Ready the better.
- **Reading Fluency & Comprehension Homework - TIME your child while he/she reads for 1 MINUTE and count the number of words read correctly. Also ask and answer comprehension questions to check for understanding** in the story/text.
- Have **your child read everyday for at least 20 minutes.** This helps to build reading fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, and spelling skills.
- Spend at least 5-minutes daily to practice **memorizing addition and subtraction facts to 20.**
- **Keep all 2nd Quarter class work papers in the ziploc** that was provided to prevent your child from losing any important papers.

How to Reset the Brain for Learning

Stress is part of the new normal with COVID19 lurking around. Our students are finding themselves faced with feelings of uncertainty and nowhere to go. This makes it difficult for students to learn. Here are some helpful tips to get students back on track to be mindful of school and completing work.

Calm the central nervous system:

Stress and trauma can trigger a reaction in the amygdala. The amygdala sends the body into fight, flight, or freeze mode. It hijacks or steals from the other parts of the brain so it becomes focused solely on responding to or fleeing the perceived threat.



To help students reset, several physical strategies are suggested.

Aloha Pauoa Students and Parents,

We have been pleasantly surprised at the low number of Chromebooks that have been damaged during distance learning. Good going Pauoa, and keep it up! We are one of the few public schools that provided full one to one computers for their students. It's great that our investment is paying off. That being said, I thought I might give you a few tips/reminders that will help you take care of the Chromebooks.

1. Never stack anything on your Chromebook.
2. Don't play with objects while working on your Chromebook. It's too easy for something to slip and crack the screen.
3. Don't keep liquids near the Chromebook.
4. Make sure the charging cord is not stretched somewhere where it can trip someone.
5. Remove the charging cord from the outlet at the plug – don't yank on the cord.
6. Remove headphones at the plug – don't yank the cord.

Following these tips will ensure that our Chromebooks will be around for the students of Pauoa for a long while.

Health aide: Mrs. Ladines (Front Office)

Families, please be mindful of the list below.

Please help us by checking your child/ren every day, at night, and especially in the morning before school starts.

Anyone with even ONE of the following symptoms:

- Feverish, unusually warm, or flushed cheeks
- Temperature of 100.0 Fahrenheit
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness, weakness)
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting (stomach ache)
- Diarrhea

Will be sent home immediately and will need to be excluded from school and may only return to school through one of three pathways:

1) After 10 days after symptoms first appeared AND no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved.

2) With a doctor's note AND no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved.

3) With a negative COVID-19 test result AND no fever for at least 24 hrs without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved.
