Technology Coordinator/Computer Science: Mr. Sutherland

Aloha Pauoa,

Our new computer science special is based on the draft CSTA (Computer Science Teachers Association) standards that are being modified and adopted for the Hawaii Department of Education. The standards are divided into 5 domains: Computing Systems, Network and the Internet, Data and Analysis, Algorithms and Programming, and the Impact of Computing. Our computer science special will focus mainly on Algorithms and Programming, touching the other standards when appropriate. Your child's homeroom teacher will be teaching your child the majority of the other standard domains.

Our K-2 students have been using their computer science special to investigate what computational thinking means. Through the use of picture books and activities, they are learning to use computational thinking to solve problems in their everyday lives. Our 3-5 students are working on Google CSFirst platform. Their first project blends ELA and computer programming in a task that asks them to build a character that reacts creatively and believably to an everyday problem - namely, forgetting their homework. This kind of assignment builds on their real-world experience to make computer science relevant to their lives.

Our October break is fast approaching! I would like to take this time to respectfully remind our Pauoa families to stay vigilant about your health and safety. Let's work together to keep our students and community safe.

On a different note, you may remember hearing, "Please fill out the Free and Reduced Meal Application form; it will help determine our Title 1 eligibility." Or, "Pauoa is a Title 1 school." Here are some tidbits to help you understand what Title 1 is. If you have any questions, please feel free to let me know!

Purpose of Title 1, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

- A Title 1, Part A grant is to provide **all** children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. (ESEA 1001)

Title 1 Eligibility

- Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) Title 1 eligibility for School Year (SY) 2021-2022 is based on a minimum poverty threshold of 47.2%, which is determined by the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced-priced meals.
- Thank you for completing the Free and Reduced Price Meal application form this school year. You are helping our school with our Title 1 eligibility requirements for next school year, 2022-2023.
- Title 1 eligibility will benefit **all** students at Pauoa.

Parent Involvement

- Parents are encouraged to be involved in their child's schooling.
 - Check their homework and Planner daily.
 - Read aloud to your child or with your child.
 - Ask them how their day was.
 - Be a lifelong learner and your child's first teacher.
 - Provide support at home.
- Be involved with the school.
 - Attend all (video/phone/in person) conferences/meetings for your child
 - Volunteer in school events when possible
 - Participate in decisions related to the education of your child
 - Join Pauoa Ohana PTA
