






Grade 5: Ms. Luong (C8), Mrs. Takahashi (C9), Mrs. Oliveira (C10)

Fourth quarter is here! In our last unit for science, we will be working on mixtures and exploring food science. Within our unit, students will be refining their scientific writing by making claims, using evidence to back up their claims, and explain their reasoning. The focus in Social Studies for this quarter will be the events leading up to the Revolutionary War. This will bring insight on how our country became independent. In math, we will continue to finish up on 5th grade concepts and review for the SBA coming up at the end of April. For ELA we are working on writing fictional narratives, covering figurative language and identifying point of views.

Please be sure to encourage your child to remain steadfast with their learning mindset, completing all classwork and homework assignments with quality, and continue to have a positive attitude. The students are striving to be independent in their academic skills, work habits, and actively engaged in their learning. Aloha Pauoa,

The school has recently submitted its final order for iPads and we will be a 100% 1:1 iPad school starting from the beginning of next year. This means that each student at Pauoa will be assigned their own iPad. The iPads offer numerous benefits over the Chromebooks. Here are some of the benefits to our school from upgrading from Chromebooks to iPads.

- They have much faster processors less time spent waiting for the computer
- They start up faster less disruption to the flow of the classroom
- Much better cameras useful for online submission of work and digital portfolios and projects
- Much better screen easier for students to view and share
- Better sharing capabilities integrated with our apple TV's for airplay
- Pen input for handwriting input
- Much better construction (we had a huge attrition rate with the chrome books
- Much better warranty Apple Care covers them for four years
- Access to the Apple app store and the millions of apps

Though the iPads are marginally more expensive (~20%), the benefits to our students and teachers clearly outweigh the added expense. One of the most important lessons we learned from the school closures due to Covid19 was that we needed our student devices to be reliable for our students to have the tools to help them succeed in their learning. Our transition to a 100% 1:1 iPad school is one of our biggest steps towards achieving that goal.




