
Welcome back to a new school year! I am excited to return for my second year as a vice principal at Pauoa Elementary. I loved seeing all the smiling faces of our students excited to return to school! The teachers spent the opening week of school building new relationships and routines for their classrooms. Our hope is that all students feel a sense of belonging and place here at Pauoa.

This year, we will emphasize the importance of attendance as we put the pandemic behind us and try to bring down our chronic absenteeism rate at the school. Chronically absent is missing more than 15 days of school in the year, which averages to around 4 days every quarter. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life. We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school— regardless of the reason – it can cause them to fall behind academically.


Important Information:







Data from the application form is used to determine our school's Title I eligibility for next school year, 2024-2025. Title I eligibility is <u>crucial</u> for our school as it provides funds to help <u>all</u> students achieve. If you need assistance, please call our Office. **The due date to submit your form will be in mid**September. We will let you know the exact date when it comes out.

Pauoa is currently a <u>Title 1</u> school. Here are some tidbits to help you understand what <u>Title 1</u> is. If you have any questions, please feel free to let me know!



• A Title 1, Part A grant is to provide <u>all</u> children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. (ESEA 1001)

Title 1 Eligibility

- Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) Title 1 eligibility for School Year (SY) 2022-2023 is based on a minimum poverty threshold of 47.2%, which is determined by the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced-priced meals.
- Thank you for completing the Free and Reduced Price Meal application form this school year. You are helping our school with our Title 1 eligibility requirements for next school year, 2024-2025.
- Title 1 eligibility will benefit <u>all</u> students at Pauoa.


