### Principal Arakaki's Message

Dear Pauoa Ohana,

I hope everyone is having a restful, relaxing and enjoyable Fall Break. We had a great first quarter as we united together in two awesome school wide activities; Mele on the Lawn and Bingo Night. Both events packed our school grounds and provided an electric vibe as we came together for the first time this school year.

We are getting better instructionally in the classroom. Although I cannot reveal our Smarter Balanced Assessment results at this time. I will be able to share our results at our School Community Council meeting in the later part of October. The results may not be where we want to be, however, we are closing the achievement gap between sub groups which is a really good sign of improvement. Our diagnostic results are almost on par with last year's first diagnostic results. We are two percentage points behind, reading is at 41% vs 43% last year and math is 31% vs 33% last year. Please continue to have your child access iReady at home for at least 45 minutes per week if they are on level (green), 60 minutes per week if they are less than a year behind grade level (yellow) or 75 minutes per week if they are more than a year behind grade level (red).

Save the date!!! We are having our Pauoa Ohana pumpkin carving activity on Oct. 24 from 5:30-7:30 or 8 pm in our café. We will be having games and read aloud put on by the Executive Women's League of Honolulu from 5:30-6:15 pm in our library. Bring your own pumpkin and carving tools to carve your pumpkin. Carving should begin approximately 6:15 pm. Prizes and goodie bags will be provided to participants. Bring your family to enjoy this fun activity.

Lastly, parent/teacher conferences will be conducted on Oct. 23, 24, 26, 27, 30, 31, Nov. 2 and 3. School on these days will end at 1:15 pm. Please make arrangements for your child to be picked up at 1:15 pm on these days. Please notify the person responsible for pickup of the change in our end time during our parent/teacher conference weeks.

Let's continue to work together, "Believe to Achieve! Stand up! Be heard! Let's excel now!"



#### Tips to help your child at home:

- Find a quiet spot for your child to read out loud 20 30 minutes a day. This will help improve your child's fluency, accuracy, intonation, and attend to punctuation = improved comprehension.
- Read to a family member each day.
- Ask your child what they are learning in school and can they teach you what they learned?
- Have your child draw or journal what they learned today.
- Play multiplication war using playing cards, dice, or dominos to build fact fluency. Try addition and subtraction war.
- Have your child multiply the 3 digits on a car's license plate.

As the holiday season approaches, please let your child's teacher know in advance if there are restrictions in their participation or celebration of specific holidays. When thinking about snacks, birthday treats, and holiday gift giving, please keep in mind that we are a nut-free school. Students within our grade level have food allergies.


#### English Language Coordinator/ Parent Involvement: Mrs. Newton (D9)
