



- 1. <u>iReady Diagnostic #3</u>: During the first week of March, our fourth graders will be completing their final iReady reading and math diagnostic tests for the year. They have all set and are working towards meeting their individual goals. Please check in with your child about reaching their goal after testing is done.
- 2. Standards Based Assessment (SBA): It will be a busy month, as we continue to work hard to prepare for the annual Standards Based Assessment which will be administered starting the end of April. To prepare at home, please continue to have your child work towards reaching their monthly reading goals, and complete iReady and other assigned homework. Also, we highly encourage your child to complete the Smarter Balanced Practice & Training tests. This will provide students with the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the navigational tools and to practice sample questions.
- **3.** Headphones: Please be sure that your child brings <u>headphones or earbuds</u> to school for the upcoming tests. There will be a listening portion for the SBA.
- 4. <u>iReady:</u> We have started new iReady homework expectations for Reading Level E. Students will complete 1 teacher assigned close reading assignment for the week.

Scratch Jr. is an excellent tool for kindergartners to learn because it introduces them to coding concepts in a fun and engaging way. Through creating interactive stories, games, and animations, children can express their creativity while developing fundamental skills like sequencing and problem-solving. Working collaboratively on projects encourages teamwork and communication skills, while the platform's intuitive interface keeps them motivated and eager to learn. By using Scratch Jr., kindergartners not only gain exposure to basic multimedia literacy but also lay the groundwork for future STEM learning. If you are looking for a way to engage your child outside of school, give Scratch Jr. a try.
