



Hello Grade 2 Families,

Thank you for your support at home! Please continue to work with your child on the following important areas:

- <u>Reading Fluency</u> Second grade's goal is to be able to read
 <u>100-128 words per minute</u> fluently, accurately, and with proper
 expression. Use a pointer finger to track the words.
- Reading Comprehension Read chapter books for at least 20 minutes or more every day. Read aloud to an adult. Also, adults please read out loud to your child to model good reading skills. Ask questions to check for understanding.
- Math Fluency Memorize <u>addition and subtraction facts</u> up to <u>20</u>
 <u>total</u> accurately and quickly, without counting on fingers.




Fifth graders have completed their iReady diagnostic in Reading and Math. This data helps us determine where each student is individually and how to help them meet or exceed our fifth grade standards. The fifth graders have also begun working on their oral fluency. Oral fluency is an integral part of comprehension. It helps the reader become proficient in vocabulary, comprehension and phonics. Encourage your child to read out loud daily. Practice reading with expressions, attending to the punctuations, pacing and comprehending what they are reading.

Soon your children will be doing different activities that involve team building. This is an exciting time for me as students will need to use Kahiau in order for them to complete different levels of the challenge.

I am excited to watch the children move and get exercise all while having fun. Hopefully, this will translate to all Pauoa students being Physically and Mentally Literate, which means making healthy choices.

This month we discuss the meaning of KAHIAU and drew pictures that represented our understanding of Kahiau which are displayed outside of the classroom. Also students learned how to greet each other in the morning (aloha kakahiaka), ask & answer; what is your name? ('o wai kou inoa?, 'o_____ ko'u inoa), and ask & answer; How are you? (Pehea 'oe?, _____ au). These simple phrases will be practiced weekly & built upon.

Next month we will start to explore Pauoa Valley kicking off our Sense of Place unit. If you have any mo'olelo (stories) or 'ike (knowledge) about Pauoa, please share it with me via note that your child may bring to our weekly classes.

Lastly, if there is information that your child is curious about, such as where their family originated from, who their elders are, please take the time to have those conversations. Sometimes we forget to
