
The school is holding one more event at the end of the year, which will need parent volunteers. More information to come. Mahalo!













Happy April everyone, Just want to highlight 3 things as we enter the last quarter of the school year: ASP, testing, and summer school.

### After school programs (ASP)

For programs offered by Pauoa, Session 4 started on March 31. Please continue to use the After School Program google site (accessed via the school website) for general messages and important dates.

For students who are in A+, they will need to return to A+ once their after school class is finished. We had instances where students told their teacher that they did not need to go back to A+. Please help us by reminding your child that they need to return to A+. If you are picking up your child right after the class, make sure to sign them out from A+ before you leave.

### **State and iReady Testing**

Grades 3, 4, and 5 will be taking their state assessments (SBA) in Reading and Math this quarter. Additionally, Grade 5 has their 2nd opportunity with Science testing. Grades K, 1, and 2 students will be taking their last Reading and Math iReady Diagnostic. Be on the lookout for your child's schedule; you should be receiving something from their teacher soon if you haven't already. Encourage your child to try their best even if the question is challenging, to take their time, and to think about what they learned when trying to figure out the answer. During testing, make sure your child is well rested, has breakfast, and comes to school on time.






Lice spread VERY easily and can be harmful if left untreated. They need human blood to live and are spread by direct contact with the hair of an infested person.


The eggs look like dandruff, are attached to the hair, are usually close to the scalp, behind the ears and nape of the neck. Lice are tan, brown or gray. They avoid the light and crawl QUICKLY. Anyone can get head lice.

Treat lice promptly. Check all household members.

Machine wash clothing and linens in HOT (130\*F) water and dry on HIGH heat. Vacuum upholstery, floors and furniture.

Closely monitor and do NOT share personal items.






- if you are going to a private school or charter school (Please inform us of your acceptance)
