

- Take your time and try your best. You can do this!




# Summer Specials

### Technology Coordinator/Computer Science: Mr. Sutherland

Our 4th graders are stepping into the exciting world of coding using **micro:bits**—small but powerful computers designed to teach the basics of programming and electronics in a fun, hands-on way. Each micro:bit is packed with amazing features: it has 25 tiny LED lights that can display images or messages, buttons that respond to touch, sensors that detect motion and temperature, and even a radio for sending signals to other micro:bits. With just a few lines of code, students can bring their devices to life—making them flash patterns, respond to a shake, or even "teleport" a digital duck to a classmate's device!

These creative coding projects aren't just fun—they're building a foundation in computer science and engineering. As students explore how hardware and software work together, they learn to think like problem-solvers and inventors. They're experimenting, collaborating, and discovering how technology can be used to design, communicate, and create. We're so proud to see our 4th graders gaining the confidence to turn ideas into action, one micro:bit project at a time!





### Hawaiian Studies: Kumu Imada

As our students get ready for the upcoming Hoʻike performance, they are learning about the many different cultures in Hawaiʻi. They are excited to share their own traditions and hear about their classmates' cultures.

This year's Ho'ike will include at least six cultural performances: Hawaiian, Japanese, Tahitian, Chinese, Māori, and Filipino dances. It is great to hear the students talking about their performances and looking forward to seeing what other grade levels will do.

Each grade level will share with families more details about performance attire and other important information. Look out for our Principal West's weekly blast for updates about this event. It will be a performance worth watching!

Happy May everyone,

This is an important time of year as students will be completing their end of year assessments and finishing up their grade level curriculum. It is extremely important that your child stay healthy and come to school on time everyday. Continue to support your child at home by making sure that they are doing their homework, getting enough sleep, and eating a healthy breakfast. Your partnership is truly appreciated!

### I **v** reading!

As you start thinking about summer plans, please continue to encourage your child to read everyday. As a former classroom teacher, I could easily tell which students read over the summer. Those that chose not to read over the summer started off the year at a disadvantage. So please, have them read! The trick is to instill the love of reading. There is nothing like holding a book, flipping the pages, and getting lost in the story. Here are some ideas:

- Set a day during the week to visit the **public library**. Oftentimes, your neighborhood library has a reading "contest" where children can read books and get prizes. If you do not already have a library card, you can fill out a quick form and it is FREE! Visit this <u>link</u> to find more information about getting a library card.

- Choose a book to **read aloud** as a family. It could be a picture book, poetry, fiction, nonfiction, chapter book, the choices are endless!
- If you have a reluctant reader, may I suggest **graphic novels.** (Note: This is different from manga!) We adults see it as "comic books," but I used graphic novels in my classroom because it helped students with comprehension, especially making inferences students needed to pay attention to the details of the pictures and what characters are saying in order to figure out how a character is feeling, make sense of the story, or make predictions on what is going to happen next. Some examples of graphic novels are Dogman, Warriors series, Wings of Fire series, The Babysitters Club, Amulet.

If you and your child like to read ebooks, you are in luck! Your child has access to a free shared ebook collection via **Sora**. This is a DOE digital library with a limited amount of books. (They may already know how to access their account!)

- If this is your child's first time, click on "Hawaii State Department of Education" OR click "I have a set up code→" On the next screen, type in **HIDOE**
- Your child's username is their 10-digit student ID. (They should know this number as they use it for iReady and testing.)
- Your child is able to borrow 5 books at a time.
- There is also a way to link your child's Sora account with the Hawaii Public Library system where there are even more books! Here is a link to help you with that:


#### **Dates of interest:**



Mahalo to all who did an online purchase for the yearbook. Distribution will be some time during the final week of school in class.




