

Hello Grade 2 Families,

Thank you for your support at home! Please continue to work with your child on the following important areas:

- Reading Fluency Second grade's goal is to be able to read 100-128 words per minute fluently, accurately, and with proper expression. Use a pointer finger to track the words to prevent accidentally skipping lines/words.
- Reading Comprehension Read chapter books for at least 15 minutes or more every day. Read aloud to an adult. Also, adults please read out loud to your child to model good reading skills. Ask questions to check for understanding.
- Math Fluency Memorize addition and subtraction facts up to 20 total accurately and quickly, without counting on fingers.

Specials classes will be on a rotation this year (rotates throughout grade levels K-5):

- **Computer Programming** with Mr. Sutherland
- Hawaiian Studies with Kumu Imada
- P.E. (Physical Education) with Mr. Asuncion

Please wear <u>athletic shoes</u>, <u>comfortable exercise clothes</u>, and <u>bring a water bottle</u> on every <u>P.E. day!</u>




Multicultural Open House Projects and C.T.E. GLO Goal-Setting
















The first month of school has passed us by so quickly! Thank you to those who attended our Open House! We look forward to meeting everyone at Parent-Teacher Conferences next month.

Fifth graders have completed their iReady diagnostic in Reading and Math. This data helps us determine where each student is individually and how to help them meet or exceed our fifth grade standards. The fifth graders have also begun working on their oral fluency. Oral fluency is an integral part of comprehension. It helps the reader become proficient in vocabulary, comprehension and phonics. Encourage your child to read out loud daily. Practice reading with expressions, attending to the punctuations and pacing.

This month, we will begin our DARE program until beginning of December. Students will learn about making safe and responsible choices when handling difficult personal problems in life, such as peer pressure and bullying. Students will have weekly sessions with Officer Pratt, depending on their homeroom's class schedule.

Our first field trip this year will be to the Pacific Fleet Submarine Museum on Tuesday, September 23rd. We will be back in time to eat lunch at school. Please be sure your child owns a red Pauoa T-shirt for this field trip and future field trips. Shoes must be worn to all field trips.



# Monthly Parent Tips How to Support your Child

#### **Get Enough Sleep Every Night**

- Establish a consistent bedtime routine. A predictable routine helps signal to your child's body and mind that it's time to wind down. This can include activities like a warm bath, brushing teeth, reading a book, or listening to quiet music.
- Create a sleep-friendly environment. The bedroom should be cool, dark, and quiet. Consider using blackout curtains, a fan, or a white noise machine to help. It's also important to keep the bed for sleeping only, avoiding activities like playing or doing homework in bed.
- Set a consistent sleep schedule. Going to bed and waking up at the same time every day, even on weekends, helps regulate the body's internal clock (circadian rhythm). This can make it easier to fall asleep and wake up feeling refreshed.
- Limit screen time before bed. The blue light from electronic devices can suppress melatonin, the hormone that promotes sleep. Experts recommend turning off screens at least an hour before bedtime.
- **Encourage daily physical activity.** Regular exercise can help improve sleep quality, but be sure to avoid vigorous activity within a few hours of bedtime, as it can be stimulating.

### SPECIALS

### **Computer Science**

This year, our students are exploring computer science through **Code.org**, an online platform designed for elementary learners. In class, students work through interactive puzzles, games, and challenges that introduce the basics of coding. They learn how to create sequences, loops, and conditionals while also experimenting with digital storytelling, interactive art, and simple games. The lessons are self-paced, so students can move step by step while building confidence in their problem-solving skills.

Code.org also gives students opportunities to work together. They share strategies, test each other's solutions, and reflect on what worked or didn't work. Along the way, they practice persistence, creativity, and teamwork—skills that support learning across all subject areas. By the end of the year, our students will have not only learned the foundations of computer science, but also discovered that coding can be fun and creative.

#### Hawaiian Studies - Kumu Imada

This month, Mr. Hosoda has introduced the theme: **Working Together to Make Pauoa Even Better**. In Hawaiian Studies, students are exploring the concept of **LAULIMA**, which emphasizes the importance of collaboration. They are sharing examples of how they demonstrate Laulima and discussing how these efforts can enhance Pauoa.

Students have discovered that Pauoa is not just the name of our school; it also refers to the surrounding valley and community. By working together, our efforts will benefit not only our school but also our entire community.

#### For instance:

- Grade 2 will focus on Ocean Pollution.
- Grade 4 will study Queen Lili'uokalani.
- Grade 5 will investigate our campus biodiversity.
