Fostering a Love of Reading

Be a Reading Role Model

Children are more likely to value reading if they see their parents doing it.

- Read in the Open: Don't just read on your phone; pick up a physical book, newspaper, or magazine and read it openly. Talk about what you're reading.
- Create Family Reading Time: Set aside a non-negotiable 20-30 minutes a
 few times a week where everyone in the family reads silently. Turn off the TV
 and put away electronics—even if your child is reading a comic book and you
 are reading a novel. The focus is on the act of reading.

Make Reading an Experience

Create positive, cozy, and special associations with books.

- **Establish a Reading Nook:** Designate a comfy space at home with soft blankets, pillows, and good light. Make this space inviting and relaxing.
- Visit the Library Regularly: Treat a trip to the local library like an exciting outing. Get your child their own library card to give them a sense of ownership and responsibility for their selections.
- Read Aloud (Even to Older Kids): Continue reading chapter books to your child even after they learn to read independently. Listening to you read exposes them to more complex language and creates a valuable bonding time.

Happy Halloween to our computer science families! This month, students are brewing up their coding skills with Code.org. Just like carving pumpkins, programming lets us design something unique and creative. With Code.org's puzzles and projects, students are practicing loops that whirl around like broomsticks, squashing tricky "boo-gs," and creating logic that is simply fang-tastic.

Coding may seem spooky at first, but with a little practice, students discover it's more treat than trick. Each lesson builds problem-solving powers, teamwork skills, and the courage to face challenges head-on (no skeletons hiding in the closet here!). Code.org helps turn learning into a real "ghoul-time," giving students both the thrills of discovery and the skills they will carry into the future.

- Grade 5: Our focus is on the plants found on our campus and learning the difference between native and invasive.


Looking ahead, in November, students will participate in the Makahiki Games, which will be an exciting opportunity for them to engage in traditional Hawaiian activities.

- 1. Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them.
- 2. Reason abstractly and quantitatively.
- 3. Construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others.
- 4. Model with mathematics.
- 5. Use appropriate tools strategically.
- 6. Attend to precision.
- 7. Look for and make use of structure.
- 8. Look for and express regularity in repeated reasoning.
