



In kindergarten and first grade, we talk a lot about patterns because they help our youngest learners start thinking like coders. When children notice what repeats and what changes, they begin to understand how to break a big task into smaller steps. This is a big part of learning how to code.

You can really see this on Code.org. For example, when students help a character move through a maze, they often find themselves using the same steps again and again. Instead of dragging out each block one by one, they learn to use a loop to repeat that pattern of moves. It feels like a little "aha" moment when they realize the computer can repeat the instructions for them.

These kinds of activities help students practice problem-solving, logical thinking, and planning ahead, all in a playful way that fits early childhood learning. Starting with simple patterns now sets them up for success as they continue exploring computer science.

 - For classes offered by outside vendors, you may register on your own at any time; these classes are on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Important dates:

- Dec. 8 Session 3 ASP registration begins.
- Dec. 11 Session 3 registration due by 2:30.
- Dec. 12 Session 2 ends for classes offered by Pauoa. If registered in an outside vendor class, please check the schedule that the director emailed you.
- Dec. 17 Session 3 ASP confirmation and wait list letters sent home.
- Jan. 7 2nd Semester Parent-Teacher conference forms sent home. Your child's teacher will be in contact with you <u>if</u> they feel a conference is necessary.
- Week of Jan. 12 Session 3 starts
- Jan. 14 Report cards sent home.
- Feb. 4 2nd Semester Parent-Teacher conferences (only if you received a form)

This is a busy time of the year both in school and with family. One of the best things you can do for your child is to keep them on their schedule: be consistent with their homework routines and make sure they are getting plenty of rest. We need them to stay healthy and be in school every day!

(The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) Outgoing 5th Grade students - please apply for a NEW GE for Gr. 6 if you are not planning to go attend your home school. Submit your request to Pauoa. GE applications for the next school year shall be submitted between January 1, 2026 - March 1, 2026 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year. You DO NOT need to re-apply for GE once you are accepted at Pauoa. Please keep the school informed if you have moved residences during your time at Pauoa.
