

Pauoa Elementary is a Title 1 school with 51% of students qualifying for free or reduced priced meals this school year. The text below explains the main purpose and components of Title 1. Title 1 funds positively impact all Pauoa Elementary stakeholders-students, teachers, and parents. With COVID-19 restrictions and having to social distance, parent involvement activities have been put on hold for now. Please continue to be involved in your child's education. We appreciate our principal, Mr. Arakaki, who has been great at communicating through his weekly e-mail message to Pauoa Elementary families.

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Title 1

Purpose of Title 1, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

• A Title 1, Part A program is to provide all children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. (ESEA section 1001)

Title 1 Eligibility

• Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) Title 1 eligibility for School Year (SY) 2020-2021 is based on a minimum poverty threshold of 47.2%, which is determined by the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced-priced meals.

NOTE: Parents if you have not already done so, please complete the 2020-2021 Free and Reduced Price Meal Application online at ezmealapp.com. After the application is processed (up to 10 working days), a notification letter will be sent home either by email or via school.

Aloha Pauoa,

Now that a majority of students are back doing in-person learning, they will be carrying their chromebooks between home and school. Here are a few tips to make sure the chromebooks keep functioning efficiently.

- Charge the chromebook every night. If it is fully charged, it should last for a whole day at school. This will help limit wear and tear on the charger and make it easier to keep track of.
- If you notice any swelling on the chromebook, or the keys or mouse pad acting weird, please let your teacher know or email me at techsupport@pauoaes.net. This is indicative of a swelling battery and we should switch out your chromebook as soon as we can.
- If the chromebook is running slow, or having other issues, let your teacher know. I can do a factory reset on the chromebook and that often helps things. We can schedule it for when the student is at school and I can provide a loaner to the student while I do this reset.
- Please try not to pack the chromebook too tightly into the student's backpack. Many of our damage incidents are caused by the chromebook being crushed.

I think if we all follow these simple suggestions, our chromebooks can remain in service for a long time.



Geographic Exception SY 2021-2022. If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for students who are already enrolled and plan to change to another DOE school. (e.g. for middle school or another DOE school) If you are currently on a GE at Pauoa you do NOT need to re-apply each year. (The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) GE applications for the upcoming 2021-2022

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school year shall be submitted between January 2 and March 2 2020 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year.
