Hello Grade 2 Families,

Thank you for your support at home! Please continue to work with your child on the following important areas:

- Reading Fluency Second grade's goal is to be able to read 128 words per minute accurately, quickly, and with proper expression. Use pointer fingers to track the words.
- Reading Comprehension Read chapter books for at least 20 minutes or more every day.

  Read out loud to an adult. Also, adults please read out loud to your child once a week to model good reading skills. Ask questions to check for understanding.
- Math Fluency Memorize addition and subtraction facts up to 20 total accurately and quickly, without counting on fingers.


#### Aloha Families,
