

- Take your time and try your best! You can do it.



If you are NOT returning to Pauoa next school year, SY 2022 - 2023, please download and complete the Pauoa Student Release form and email it to office@pauoaes.net (See link below)

Pauoa Student Release Form

Please submit your request by Wednesday, May 11, 2022.

- if you are going to a private school or charter school (Pls inform us of your acceptance)
- if you are moving out of state or country
- if you are going to another **DOE** school and not returning to Pauoa for school year 2022 -2023.
- 5th graders moving to 6th grade at Kawananakoa or Stevenson DO NOT need to fill this form..

Withdrawal packets will be ready afterschool on the last day of school, 5/26/22 or thereafter. You will need to take these items to your new school for enrollment.

Should you have any questions please contact us at 587-4500.

Teachers, Parents please remind your students not to bring their IDs home. They need their IDs in school to purchase lunch.

Also for students returning to Pauoa next school year, IDs need to be submitted to their teachers on their last day of school so that they can be used again during the early part of next school year until students receive their new IDs.

Parents please turn in your Request for Student Release Form as soon as possible so we know whether your students are transferring to a Hawaii DOE Public School, to a Hawaii Private School or to a School on the Mainland. If your students have meal balances, a School Meal Account Refund Request Form need to be completed. Depending on where your child will be going and depending on your requests, meal balances will be processed accordingly. Refunds will take longer to be processed this school year, so the sooner you turn in the forms, the better.
