Dear Pauoa Ohana.

Thank you everyone for an exciting guarter 1. We came together for our Open House in a packed cafeteria and we brought the house down with our Mele on the Lawn featuring our very own Mana Mele of Pauoa, Mana Maoli's Youth Collective Band, Halau I Ka Wekiu and Ten Feet. What a way to open SY 24-25.

Like I stated in Pauoa Ohana Blast #9, we have completed our WASC self study as we will be visited in November for our second round of accreditation. The following is our student learner needs:

- Students need a comprehensive, vertically-aligned curriculum that is driven by a clear, standards-based plan in order to improve academic proficiency. (We have 60% of our staff that are new to Pauoa. We need to redefine and reintroduce this to everyone to get the teaching staff on the same page)
- 2. Students need a comprehensive writing curriculum that supports the development of writing skills through a vertically aligned progression (K-5), using anchor pieces, common formative assessments, and common rubrics.
- Pauoa needs a school-wide GLO assessment process 3. so our students can understand how to improve in grit, work habits, and self-reflection to be successful.

We have realized that 62% of our staff (18/29 teachers) are new to Pauoa having been here less than 5 years. We have gone back to basics reviewing with everyone our school improvement system as 18 teachers were not here when we designed it. More to come at our School Community Council meeting on Oct. 29, 2024 from 5:30-7:45 pm.

Come and join us for our Pumpkin Carving Night scheduled for Tuesday, Oct. 29, 2024 from 5:30-7:45 pm in our cafeteria. There will be games and prizes to be given away. It will surely be a night filled with fun, laughter and Joy. **Save that date: Tuesday, Oct. 29, 2024 from 5:30-7:45 pm.**

Lastly, parent/teacher conferences will be conducted on Oct. 21, 22, 24, 25, 28, 29, 31, Nov. 1. School on these days will end at 1:15 pm. Please make arrangements for your child to be picked up at 1:15 pm on these days. 

 Families, please <u>DO NOT help your child</u> with any hints since the i-Ready program is adaptive and will adjust to each student's specific learning needs.



As we start the second quarter, we would like to remind families that Parent -Teacher Conferences are occurring Oct 21st - Nov 1st.

Tips to help your child at home:

- Find a quiet spot for your child to read out loud at least 30 minutes a day. This will help improve your child's fluency, accuracy, intonation, and attend to punctuation = improved comprehension.
- Read to a family member each day.
- Ask your child what they are learning in school and can they teach you what they learned?
- Have your child draw or journal what they learned today.
- Play multiplication war using playing cards, dice, or dominos to build fact fluency. Try addition and subtraction war.
- Have your child multiply the 3 digits on a car's license plate.

As the holiday season approaches, please let your child's teacher know in advance if there are restrictions in their participation or celebration of specific holidays. When thinking about snacks, birthday treats, and holiday gift giving, please keep in mind that we are a nut-free school. Students within our grade level have food allergies.

For future trips/long absences, please remember to let your child's teacher and the office know in advance.
